

Lonsdale ends Orioles win streak; Montgomery wins 4th in a row

New Prague Orioles suffered their first loss of the D-R-S season but continue to lead the Red Division, New Market maintained a half game edge in the White Division standings and Prior Lake leads the Blue Division by the same margin.
